Senator Siles Introduced a Bill Asking for an Appropriation.

IT PROVIDES FOR \$20,000

For the Two Years Commencing June
1, 1891, for the Purpose of Maintenance—Chances for Getting
It Are Good.

Senator Stiles yesterday introduced an act in the senate making an appropriation to the Allentown Hospital of \$20,000. The bill is as follows: AN ACT.

Making an appropriation to the Allentown Hospital Association at Allentown.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same that the sum of twenty thousand doliars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby specifically appropriated to the Alientown Hospital Association at Allentown, for the two fiscal years commencing June 1, 1891, for the purpose of maintenance. Said appropriation to be paid in accordance with the provisions of an act of assembly approved March 15, 1899.

Senator Stiles will make every affort to push the bill through the senate, and it will reveelve cordial support from Representatives Roth. Mayne and Moyer. The hospital needs the money and as Senator Stiles commands a great deal of influence the indications are that the appropriation

will be made.
