It Was Given in the Lyric Theatre
Last Evening Under the Auspices of

Program Was Rendered.

An audience that completely filled the first floor and balcony of the Lyric Theatre greeted the participants in the musicale given under the auspices of the "M. U. M." Circle, last evening for the benefit of the Allentown Hospital. The program as published was rendered with the exception of the selection by the Big Four Quartet, for which a piano solo by Ray J. G.
