Ellwood L. Newhard was in Lancaster yesterday making arrangements for the production of Pennsylvania German "Pinafore" in that city at an early date. He found public sentiment greatly in favor of its production and it is practically certain that the circle of the King's Daughters and the Ladies' Auxillary of the General Hospital will take hold of the matter and give a benefit for the hospital.

The chorus as well as nearly all the leading roles will be filled by Lancaster parties. They have plenty of good talent in that city, capable of filling all the roles in the opera and as it is given strictly under the auspices of local organizations it is not more than right that the chorus, as well as the principals, should be natives. And they can speak a superior kind of Dutch up there. At least that is what Editor Diffenderfer, of the "New Era," says.
