BAZAAR FOR THE HOSPITAL.

It Will Open in Lehigh Valley Hall on Saturday Evening.

The preparation for the bazaar to be held by the Ladies' Auxilliary of the Hospital Association in Lehigh Valley Hall are progressing nicely and all will be in readiness to open Saturday evening, May 25th, at 7 o'clock. There will be ten booths decorated by different firms in town. The needlework booth, in charge of the Golden and Silver Cross Circle, will have all kinds of fine needle work, pin cushions and sofa cushions. The novelty booth, in charge of the Loving Service Circle of St. John's Reformed Church, will be mainly for children. They will have a great variety of dolls and toys. Some of the dolls were donated by the Vice President's wife Mrs. Theodore Roosevelt, Mrs. Governor Stone and Reading, Pottsville and Allentown Hospitals. One of the prettiest is a doll donated by the late Mrs. S. G. Wagner.

The apron booth, in charge of the Benevolent Circle, will have aprons galore, from a fine lace to a common gingham kitchen apron. The flower booth, in charge of the Faithful Workers, will have all kinds of cut flowers, palms and potted plants. The peanut booth is the next. The committee has been working hard to have plenty of Allentown's favorite esculent on hand. Then comes the lemonade and iced tea booth, in charge of the Merry Maidens. The candy booth in charge of competent ladies, will have all kinds of sweetmeats on hand, home made taffies in various styles and fine candies. The fish pond, an attraction for the children, has on hand a fine assortment of packages, handsome prizes were donated by different merchants.

The cake booth will have on hand all sorts of home made cakes, and those in charge kindly ask the patrons of the bazaar to patronize them instead of doing their own baking at home. The ice cream booth will be next to the cake. They will have all flavors on hand and courteous and obliging ladies to wait on the people. The tenth booth will be the bureau of information and for the use of the officers. The different committees kindly ask donations and hope the bazaar will be generously patronized, as the ladies are anxious to have encouraging results. There will be different attractions each evening and as the admission is only ten cents there should be crowds each evening.
