NURSES TO GRADUATE.

The Commencement Exercises Will be Held in the Lyric Theatre on Thursday.

The first commencement of the Allentown Hospital will be held at 10 o'clock Thursday morning in the Lyric Theatre. The class consists of Miss Mabel E. Brown, Miss Elsie G. Evans and Miss Elizabeth E. Kratz, all of this city.

The exercises will be opened with prayer by Rev. J. F. Pollock, pastor of the Presbyterian Church. Rev. Dr. J. A. Singmaster, president of the Hospital Association, will make a few remarks. He will be followed with an address by Professor Edward F. Davis, professor of obstetrics in Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia. The diplomas will then be conferred by Rev. Dr. J. A. Singmaster. Klingler's Orchestra will furnish music and the benediction will be pronounced by Rev. Rufus D. Naylor, pastor of Linden Street M. E. Church.

An invitation is extended by the association to all friends of the hospital to attend the exercises. No cards will be required for admission. The only seats to be reserved are those in the first three rows of the orchestra circle, which will be occupied by the relatives and friends of the graduating nurses.

To avoid the confusion usually found on similar occasions, the ushers will not carry flowers or gifts to the graduates on the stage. It is desired that all such articles intended for the graduates be left at the hospital.
