HOSPITAL BILL PASSED

It Went Through the House
Without a Dissenting Vote.

GOES TO THE SENATE TO-DAY

It Provides for an Appropriation of
\$20,000, One-Half for Maintenance
and the Balance for Furnish-
ing the New Wing.

The Stiles bill appropriating \$20,000 to the hospital was last evening passed finally in the house at Harrisburg as amended—that is, one-half for maintenance and one-half for furnishing. This is in accordance with the wish of the hospital trustees.

Senator Stiles telephoned that this morning the senate would take up the bill and he would move to concur with the house. All that will be necessary then is the signature of the governor.

The vote of the house was 151 in favor and no opposition.

Hon. Jere. Roth also telegraphed last evening to the "Morning Call" that the bill had passed the house finally.

THEY HAVE \$1300.
