With the presentation of this report, the present term has been completed. The President has retired to become first Vice-President. The re-nomination and election of the Treasurer, Corresponding, Recording and Financial Secretaries and two Directors, and with the election of a President and a 2nd Vice-President, the Board is completed for the coming two-year term.

There were six business meetings, six Board meetings, 31 Sewing Sessions with 378 in attendance.

Our cutting Chairman reports 7,475 yards cut, 5912 finished articles, $1,682\frac{1}{2}$ hours of sewing and 97 surgical dressing hours.

The Financial Secretary reports 10 new members, 2 new Life members, 19 deaths, 43 demitted, 769 active and 68 Life members, total 837.

A group of Auxiliary members have made 152,900 dressings for the Hospital.

The Auxiliary sponsored the Spring Eastern Regional meeting held at the Hospital. Fifteen members attended the Fall meeting at Muhlenberg Medical Center, Two representatives attended the Penna. Asso. of Hospital Auxiliaries Meeting in Atlantic City.

Our President represented the Auxiliary at the meeting held in Harrisburg.

Curtains and draperies have been replaced in the Hospital Entrance and Solarium. Upholstery work has been completed in the Nurses Parlors.

An ambulance was donated to the City by the Auxiliary. sum of \$25.00 was contributed to the United Fund and \$34,000.00 was paid to liquidate the pledge and reduce the interest on the

The annual dinner-dance was held at Frolics Ballroom on May 25th. The forty-five members of the Class of 1963, the Class Advisor, and the Associate Director of Nursing were guests.
